The American Civil Liberties Union of Tennessee (ACLU-TN) is the state's guardian of freedom. We work in the courts, at the legislature and in communities statewide to promote and protect the individual rights guaranteed by the Constitution.

The ACLU-TN's Communications Program spearheads the organization's public education work and oversees communications with the media. The Program also launches multimedia advocacy campaigns, drafts and publishes reports and program materials, manages the organization's website and other online communications, including the e-alert network and social media outlets, and keeps ACLU-TN members and supporters apprised of ACLU-TN's work.

The communications intern's primary responsibility will be to work with ACLU-TN's Communications Department on a variety of projects.
