POVERTY AND WELFARE RIGHTS

ACCESS TO GOVERNMENT BENEFITS

ACLU does not represent individuals who are applying for, or appealing a denial of, government benefits (Temporary Assistance to Needy Children/TANF, General Assistance/GA, Food Stamps, Medicare, TennCare, Social Security, and Supplemental Security Income/SSI). Individuals with these concerns should contact Legal Services or county welfare agencies.

WELFARE

Financial need is the basic requirement for receiving welfare. Four categories of people are generally able to receive benefits: the aged, the blind, the permanently or totally disabled, and people with dependent children. Any person can apply for welfare. While one may not necessarily be entitled to receive it, no one can be denied the opportunity to fill out the application. A person who is denied welfare is entitled to be told why the application was denied, told what the applicable law is, and be given the right to appeal if benefits are denied. 45 CFR sec. 206.10(a)(4). The federal government makes money available to states to finance these benefits. In Tennessee, welfare for families with dependent children is called "Families First" and currently operates in compliance with Federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). Some states may also provide additional benefits, called "general assistance," which is welfare aid provided by state and local governments to those who do not qualify for federal assistance. Tennessee does not have general assistance programs in effect at this time. New federal law requirements, and to a lesser extent state law, restrict aid to immigrants and the unemployed.

Where to Apply: There is a welfare office in every county, and applicants must apply at their local office. Applicants must apply in person, but can bring someone along if they need help filling out or reading the application.

How long does it take? The welfare department will make its determination and notify recipients of a decision by mail within 45 days (or 90 days for some Medicaid applicants) of submitting an application.

How much do I get? Benefits are computed to cover a family's basic needs like food and clothing, and are computed based on the number of people in the family and the category of aid they are eligible for.

TENNCARE

TennCare is a government-operated medical assistance program designed for people who are eligible for Medicaid, as well as for some children who do not have insurance. TennCare is a Medicaid waiver, or demonstration program. Its purpose is to demonstrate that the use of managed-care principles can generate sufficient savings to enable the state to cover more than Medicaid eligible people.

PATIENTS' RIGHTS

A common type of discrimination against low income people in hospital emergency rooms is to transfer people to a public hospital even though the first hospital could treat them. This is called "dumping" and national hospital standards provide that no hospital should arbitrarily transfer someone if the hospital to which he was initially brought has means to adequately care for the patient.

DUE PROCESS

Welfare and Medicaid recipients are entitled to a fair hearing any time that:

- A request for aid is denied;
- A request for aid is not acted upon within 45 days;
- A request for aid is only partly granted;
- Aid being received is reduced, suspended or terminated; or
- Aid is paid in the form of vendor or third-party payments.

FREE SCHOOL LUNCHES

The National School Lunch Act provides that "every child from a family whose income falls below the poverty line

will receive a free or reduced price lunch." The law provides federal funds to school districts for free and below-cost school lunches. If a school gets money under this program, the school board **must** provide school lunches for *all* eligible children in the district (not just the younger ones). Despite this law, many schools do not have school lunch programs. If a school has no kitchen, the school board must make other arrangements to ensure that all students receive a nutritious lunch.
