VOTING RIGHTS AND ELECTIONS

Many complaints about voting and the electoral process raise civil-liberties issues, usually related to either the First Amendment or to the Fourteenth Amendment (equal protection and due process). Typical examples are rights of minor parties to get on the ballot, ballot-technology issues and the right to circulate petitions.

VOTING RIGHTS ACT

In 1982 Congress amended and extended the Voting Rights Act of 1965, which provides powerful remedies for discrimination in voting. Historically, explicit laws, and later literacy and English requirements served to effectively exclude many minorities or immigrants from voting. The Voting Rights Act bans literacy tests and gives victims of discrimination the right to go to court to seek judicial remedies. Further, it provides that non-English speaking voters are entitled to oral assistance completing a ballot. To challenge a practice, plaintiffs must show that as a consequence of the use of the practice, minorities have less opportunity than other members of the electorate to participate in the political process and to elect representatives of their choice to office. Questions, comments and concerns relating to the Voting Rights Act should be addressed to the federal Attorney General's offices.

WHO CAN VOTE

Can I vote in Tennessee?

You can vote in the election if you're registered to vote by the registration deadlines. Please check County Election commission office for deadlines, and voting dates.

You can register if you meet **all** of the following qualifications:

- (1) you're a U.S. Citizen;
- (2) you're a resident of Tennessee;
- (3) you'll be at least 18 years old on Election Day; and

(4) you're not convicted of an infamous crime (unless your rights have been restored).

What if I'm a student?

You can register to vote at whatever address you regard as your primary legal residence. This can be your school address or your home address.

What if I've been convicted of a crime?

If you were convicted of a misdemeanor in Tennessee, you can vote, but you may have to vote by absentee ballot if you're still in jail.

If you were convicted of a felony in Tennessee, you can ask to have your right to vote restored if you:

- (1) weren't convicted of certain felonies committed during certain years;
- (2) were released from jail or prison;
- (3) finished probation and parole;
- (4) paid all court-ordered restitution;
- (5) are current on all court-ordered child support; and
- (6) secure authorized signatures to a Certificate of Restoration that then must be approved by the State Election Commission.

What if I'm homeless?

You don't need a home to register, but you do have to identify a place of residence (which can be a street corner, a park, a shelter, or any other place where you usually stay.) If you register to vote by mail, you'll also have to give a mailing address where you can receive mail (for example, a shelter).



VOTER REGISTRATION

You can register to vote:

- (1) In person, by filling out a voter registration application at your county election commission
- (2) By mail, by filling out a mail-in voter registration application and mailing it to your county election commission, or
- (3) When you apply for services at the Department of Safety (motor vehicles division) and state agencies that provide public assistance or services to people with disabilities. You may also be able to register at many other state and federal offices and agencies.

You can mail-in voter registration applications from your county election commission, from public libraries, public high schools, or online at http://sos.tn.gov/products/elections/voter-registration-application-form-ss-3010;

You **must** register to vote **30 days** before the election. If you move or change your name you **must** re-register or you will not be able to vote.

County election commissions can also assist people in determining who their elected state representative or senator is.

You can check your registration status online at https://tnmap.tn.gov/voterlookup/ or by calling your election commission.

VOTING EARLY

Can I vote before Election Day?

Yes. Any registered voter can vote before Election Day by casting a ballot in person at a county election commission office.

You may also be able to vote by mail before Election Day if you're registered to vote and you meet **any** of the following conditions:

(1) you'll be out of town during the early voting period and on Election Day;

- (2) you (or your spouse) are away at college;
- (3) you're serving on a jury;
- (4) you're 65 or older;
- (5) you're hospitalized or disabled;
- (6) you're a candidate for office in this election;
- (7) you're an election worker;
- (8) religious reasons prevent you from voting during the early voting period or on Election Day; or
- (9) you have a valid commercial driver's license and will be working out of town during the early voting period and on Election Day and have no out-of-county locations to which your mail can be sent.

You can also get an emergency ballot if you're hospitalized in your town and will be unable to vote in person on Election Day or if you become unable to go to the polls in person within a few days of the election because of the death of a relative or because you have to testify in a court case. For specific rules and stipulations for the emergency ballot, please contact your local election commission office.

How do I vote early in person?

Early voting takes place between certain dates at your county election commission office. Contact your county election commission for dates, hours, and more information.

How do I get a ballot by mail?

For application deadlines please contact your local election commission office. You can get an application for an absentee ballot from your county election commission.

To get an emergency ballot, you have to submit an application no later than the opening of the polls on Election Day.



What's the deadline for returning my ballot by mail?

To be counted, your by-mail ballot must be received by your county election commission office no later than the close of the polls on Election Day.

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

Can I get time off from work to vote?

Maybe. If your work schedule begins less than 3 hours after the polls open and ends less than 3 hours before the polls close, you have the right to take time off from work (up to three hours of which must be paid time off) in order to vote. You have to notify your employer, at least a day in advance, and your employer has the right to specify which hours you get to take. Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-1-106.

Where do I vote?

On Election Day, you have to vote at the polling place to which you're assigned.

Your assigned polling place will be listed on the voter registration card that you should receive in the mail when you register.

If you don't have your card, you can call your county election commission or look up your polling place online at https://tnmap.tn.gov/voterlookup/.

What if my polling place is not accessible?

Contact your election commission right away. You have the right to an accessible polling place and an accessible voting machine. Or, if you prefer, you can vote by mail.

If you're 65 or older or have a disability, you have the right to vote at your election commission's office on Election Day. You have to fill out an affidavit form stating that your designated voting location is not accessible. Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-3-109.

You can also bring one or more people to assist you at the polls. You have the right to have anyone you choose assist you as long as the person is not your employer, an agent of your employer, or an officer or agent of your labor union.

Can I get a ballot in my native language?

Election materials in Tennessee are generally available in English only, but you have the right to bring an interpreter with you to the polls or to get assistance in your language from anyone you choose, including a poll worker, as long as the person is not your employer, an agent of your employer, or an officer or agent of our labor union.

What if I need help in the voting booth?

If you need help because of a physical disability or because you can't read the ballot, tell a poll worker when you get to your polling place. You have the right to vote on an accessible voting machine. You also have the right to have anyone you choose assist you in the voting booth, including a poll worker. However, that person cannot be your employer, an agent of your employer, or an officer or agent of your labor union. Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-7-116.

If you need instructions on how to use the voting equipment, ask a poll worker for help. Poll workers are required to help you at any time you ask – even after you've entered the voting booth.

VOTER ID

Do I have to show ID?

Most likely. On January 1, 2012, Tennessee's law requiring a state or federally issued photo ID to vote went into effect. If you are voting in person, you must show a government-issued ID that includes your name and photo.

You won't need to show a photo ID if you live and vote in a nursing home, vote by mail, are hospitalized, have a religious objection to being photographed, or are low-income and don't have enough money to pay for a photo ID. (See: "What if I don't have any ID?" below)

What ID can I show to vote?

You can use a Tennessee driver's license, a U.S. passport, a photo ID issued by the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security, a photo ID issued by the federal or any state government, a U.S.



military ID, or a state-issued handgun carry permit with your photo, even if they are expired.

What if I am a first-time voter?

If you registered to vote by mail, you have to vote in person the first time you vote [unless you're a permanent absentee voter]. If you bring expired photo ID to the polls or qualify for an exemption from the photo ID law, you will need to show a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or any other government document that shows your name and address.

Are there any photo IDs that will not work?

You cannot use college student IDs, even from public universities. You cannot use photo IDs that are not from the federal government or a state government.

What if I don't have any ID?

If you forgot to bring your ID, it's usually better to go get it. If you don't have time or an ID, you can cast a provisional ballot. For your provisional ballot to count, you have to show the right ID to the county election commission office by closing time within two days after the election day. Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-7-112.

You can get a free ID by going to the nearest Driver Service Center, showing them proof of citizenship and two proofs of TN residency and signing an affidavit stating that you do not have a valid government-issued photo ID for voting purposes.

If you are low-income and can't afford a copy of the documents required to get a free photo ID, you may still vote if you sign a form stating under oath that you are indigent and have been unable to get a photo ID for voting without paying a fee.

PROBLEMS AT THE POLLS

What if I'm not on the voter list?

First, ask a poll worker to check the list again and to confirm that you're at the right polling place.

If you're at the right polling place but your name isn't on the voter list, ask for a provisional ballot. You have the right to cast a provisional ballot, even if your name is not on the voter list, as long as you're willing to swear that you believe you registered to vote. Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-7-112.

What if I go to the wrong polling place?

Go to the right polling place. You can ask a poll worker to help you find the polling place where you're registered. You can also call your county election commission office or look up your polling place online at https://tnmap.tn.gov/voterlookup/. I

If you can't figure out where you're registered, go to the polling place that you think is most likely to be the right one and ask for a provisional ballot. You have the right to cast a provisional ballot even if you're not sure that you're at the right polling place.

What if someone challenges my right to vote?

Election judges will ask you some questions and rule on the challenge. If the judges rule against you unanimously, you have the right to cast a special ballot, but that ballot will not be counted. If the judges don't rule against you unanimously, you have the right to cast a regular ballot. Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 2-7-102, 2-7-123, 2-7-125.

TIPS FOR AVOIDING PROBLEMS

- Check your voter registration status at least 30 days before the election.
- Vote before Election Day, using early voting or voting by mail, if you're eligible to do so.
- If you plan to vote at the polls, locate your polling place at least 30 days before the election.
- Vote early in the day to avoid the last-minute rush.
- Bring proper identification.
- Read all instructions carefully.
- Ask for help if you need it.
- Take your time. You have up to 5 minutes in the voting booth to cast your ballot if other voters are waiting and 10 minutes otherwise. Tenn. Code Ann. § 2-7-118
