As of September 29, 2016 0800 hrs., there are no specific threats to law enforcement on social media.


MEMPHIS INCIDENTS OF INTEREST

Tuesday, September 27, 2016: The US District Attorney General (USDAG) released that no federal charges would be filed against former Memphis Police Officer Connor Shilling. Shilling shot and killed Darrius STEWART on July 17, 2015 when STEWART assaulted Shilling while being arrested for felony warrants. This case has been followed closely by several local activists on social media. MPD/OHS received information from a reliable source that there will be a demonstration today (September 28, 2016) at 1300 hrs in front of Cecil C. Humphry's School of Law (located at 1 North Front Street. Only a few demonstrators attended. Most notable Frank Gibson (Frank Gotti) and Ian Jeffries.

Saturday, September 24, 2016: Officers were on the scene of a prowler call at when two males fired shots at two officers. Officers did not return fire and no injuries were reported. Officers arrested Jamarian Johnson, M/B, 23 at and recovered three firearms. A search for the second suspect was being conducted by Aviation and Canine (Memphis Police Department Report Number 1609013581ME). This case is still on-going.

NATIONWIDE INCIDENTS OF INTEREST

Wednesday, September 28, 2016 Townville, South Carolina: The Townville Police
Department (TPD) received a call of an active shooter at Townville Elementary
School. Officers arrive and arrest a fourteen (14) year old male student. The
suspect shot a teacher and two (2) students. Jamie Brock a veteran thirty year
firefighter tackled the suspect. Brock's actions are credited with preventing
additional victims. In a follow-up investigation at the suspect's house officers
found the suspect's father dead in the home.

• Wednesday, September 28, 2016 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania: The Philadelphia Police Department (PPD) responded to a shots fired call in the Cobbs Creek section of town. Officers arrived and found several family members stabbed inside. Officers searched the area for the suspect and found him near Cobbs Creek and Webster. Officers ordered the suspect to take his hands out of his pockets the suspect refused and officers shot and killed the suspect. In a follow-up investigation in the area officers found two additional stabbing victims. The victims of the stabbing spree were taken to the hospital. The victims are expected to survive. The PPD has not yet released the name of the suspect. No officers were reported injured.

CJIS Media Policy

Background

The Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) Security Policy states:

CJIS Security Policy (July 2012 Version 5.1)

5.8.3 Electronic Media Sanitization and Disposal

The agency shall sanitize, that is, overwrite at least three times or degauss electronic media prior to disposal or release for reuse by unauthorized individuals. Inoperable electronic media shall be destroyed (cut up, shredded, etc.). The agency shall maintain written documentation of the steps taken to sanitize or destroy electronic media. Agencies shall ensure the sanitization or destruction is witnessed or carried out by authorized personnel.

Purpose

Compliance with CJIS Security requirements

Employees of the Memphis Police Department will ensure that all media containing sensitive or classified information is disposed of properly. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions will apply:

Sensitive/Classified Media - Any papers or records; any data diskettes, hard drives or other data storage device that contain information which is:

- Personal in nature (Address, Social security Numbers, Drivers License Information, etc) or is
- TIES, NCIC or Criminal Justice Information Systems Related.

Sanitization – removal of all information from disks and drives through degaussing, overwriting or destruction.

Hard copies and printouts containing sensitive or classified information shall be destroyed in one of three manners:

- 1. Personal shredder
- 2. Delivered and shredded at Central Supply. A TIES certified officer must accompany the material until it has been properly disposed of.
- 3. Place the documents in the "Shred-it" bin. The bin is to remain secured and a TIES certified officer must accompany the contents to the "shred-it" truck and observe the disposal of the materials.

No one, including City of Memphis Information Technology personnel, will be permitted to remove any MPD computer, laptop, file server or copy machine until the hard drives have been sanitized. If sanitization of a hard drive is necessary for the removal of equipment, the Supervisor of MPD Information Systems will be notified and will be responsible for ensuring sanitization is accomplished in a timely manner.




Brief overview of the social climate in the 1960's and the 1970's.

2016: A Year of Social Unrest Reminiscent of the late 1960's and early 1970's

- The Memphis Police Department has been working diligently to accommodate groups that wish to voice their concerns over issues that Memphians want to address.
- The Memphis Police Department's goal is to provide public safety for those individuals that wish to voice their opinions and concerns.
- The Memphis Police Department has information from various sources that small groups of individuals use these legitimate public venues to advance their own agenda. The Memphis Police Department has information from reliable sources that these small groups intend to cause violence and destroy property using these public venues.

Blue Suede Shoes


- The Memphis Police Department received information from these sources before, and during Elvis Week that a group of individuals wanted to use a protest on the night of the Elvis Presley Candlelight Vigil to incite violence.
- The information from these sources and real time information from plain clothes officers embedded in the demonstration suggested that a few members of this protest group intended to draw officers into a physical confrontation. This physical confrontation would be used to escalate the violence.
- Individuals were encouraged to bring cellphones and video cameras to capture officers arresting or assaulting protesters.
- Through extensive planning and preparation the plan to escalate the violence at this demonstration failed. The protesters voiced their concerns, the vigil went as planned, and only three (3) individuals were arrested.

- The pattern discussed in this presentation is being played out in metropolitan areas all across the United States. Small groups of radical individuals are hijacking legitimate public groups that want to make improvements.
- These smaller radical groups use these peaceful demonstrations as opportunities to use violence and destruction to promote or advance their own agendas.

Pick a target - MPD

Freeze it—Social media and media pictures with protesters on one side and the police on the other.

Personalize it—older people getting arrested by the police, young college students, women

Polarize—The MPD opposes groups that want to voice their concerns, unhappiness, displeasure... etc

Conclusion:

- An expressed goal of one of these smaller radical groups is to embarrass law enforcement in order to undermine the bond between law enforcement and the community.
- For the most part these stratagems and these goals by these small groups of radical individuals have not worked in Memphis, Tennessee. The citizens of Memphis are aware that officers with the Memphis Police Department is not perfect, but officers are doing their best to reduce crime, allow the public to make their issues known, and maintain order.

Shortly after the Black Lives Matter (BLM) demonstration at the I-40 Bridge the Memphis Police Department received information of a demonstration at Graceland during Elvis week.

On Tuesday, July 12, 2016 dozens of protesters blocked Elvis Presley Blvd. MPD arrested six (6) individuals during this demonstration.

Keedran Franklin (Keedran TNT Franklin) identified himself as the leader of the demonstration.

Blue Suede Shoes: Aug 15, 2016

- The Memphis Police Department received information from sources before, and during Elvis Week that a group of individuals wanted to use a protest on the night of the Elvis Presley Candlelight Vigil to incite violence.
- The information from these sources and real time information from plain clothes officers embedded in the demonstration suggested that a few members of this protest group intended to draw officers into a physical confrontation. This physical confrontation would be used to escalate the violence.
- Individuals were encouraged to bring cellphones and video cameras to capture officers arresting or assaulting protesters.
- Through extensive planning and preparation the plan to escalate the violence at this demonstration failed. The protesters voiced their concerns, the vigil went as planned, and only three (3) individuals were arrested.
