By the end, we do not mean the cessation, but the bottom of the spiral. We can only speculate on what will occur once that critical mass is reached and the effect reaching it will have on ALL of Memphis. However, the members of Memphis Tomorrow, as an organization that represents the rich and the powerful in the city, has the responsibility to address and redress the myriad challenges in Memphis in an accountable and meaningful way.

Memphis Tomorrow states as its purpose: "to engage the highest ranking officers, and the resources of their companies, in fostering prosperity and quality of life for all who live in our community." You, along with your fellow tenant, The Greater Memphis Chamber, have extended the concept and application of sharecropping into the modern age. Your actions and policies, quite simply put, perpetuate poverty, while you simultaneously promote yourselves as guardians of the common good for our city. In that sense, you are charlatans.

You have had free-reign to operate for the past 15 years. The issues have now become even more pressing. Those issues concern the lives and well-being of a significant number of the citizens of this city. Your way of doing business is responsible for the continued scarcity of resources via your deceptive cover of being caring, responsible businesses.

We have had our fill of insults to our intelligence and deceptions. Business as usual is done. In all sincerity, we are committed to bring about an end to economic apartheid (pronounced: apart-hate) that Memphis Tomorrow and The Greater Memphis Chamber are perpetuating. As a good faith effort, we are requesting that you use your considerable influence to halt the use of temporary job agencies in Memphis, which are an unnecessary third party in hiring and drain money from the pockets of the workers.
